WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump signed an executive order on January 20 directing the federal government to investigate censorship practices and ensure Americans' free speech rights are not infringed.

The order comes amid growing debates over the role of social media platforms in moderating content.

Trump accused tech companies of suppressing conservative voices, calling their actions a violation of constitutional rights.

"No American should fear being silenced for their beliefs," Trump said during a press conference.

The executive order has sparked intense debate, with free speech advocates welcoming the move while critics argue it could lead to government overreach.

Legal experts caution that balancing free expression with content moderation will remain a contentious issue in the digital age.
